## "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"

On Christmas Eve Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican which marked the beginning of the Jubilee Year during which he wants us all, members of the Church, to be "Pilgrims of Hope." The Jubilee will end on 6anuary 2026. During this year there will be a number of events, including some "mini" Jubilees, inviting us all to find ourselves in at least one of the categories.

The Pope took the unusual step of opening a Holy Door in a prison in Rome to remind us that the love and mercy of God extend to all the corners of the world, and that no one is excluded. He challenges us to find Hope no matter who or where we are. As "Pilgrims of Hope" we will bring the virtue and blessing of Hope into a world which sometimes descends into despair and hopelessness; to bring Love into a world riven with war, conflict, hatred, bitterness, and violence; to bring Faith to those who may have drifted away from the Church, Mass, the Sacraments, and Prayer.

On 28 March we will be invited to join the Holy Father in spending "24 Hours for the Lord."

**Looking back on 2024** is an opportunity to thank God for the blessings we've known in the past year, to ask for forgiveness for anything hurtful we've said or done; to learn from the mistakes we've made; and to resolve to be better and do better in 2025.

On Sunday 26 January there will be a meeting in The Open Door Complex, Bellaghy, at 2pm for couples getting married in our parishes in 2025 and 2026. If you know of such a couple, please let them know about the meeting, and encourage them to attend. It will be an important part of their preparations for their future as husband and wife.

With St Paul in our second reading this weekend, we pray: "May He enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope His call holds for you, what rich glories He has promised the saints will inherit."
